## Just a THOUGHT

### PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

What inspires us to plan for the future? Our plans can be what to do today or next week. Or, we can build plans for our retirement. The prayers and readings at Mass should inspire us to seek a goal or goals that are beneficial for us and our families. In our Gospel this week, the Disciples James and John ask Jesus, their Teacher, if they should “call down fire from heaven to consume” the residents of the Samaritan Village who would not listen to the message of new life and new goals that Jesus taught. Jesus’ response is to “rebuke them,” or to remind them that life in the will of the Father is not achieved with negative actions or responses to different situations. God the Father has sent Jesus to teach all of us about how we can achieve “retirement” with Him in heaven. This may sound like a simple plan, but we know that life here on earth in our daily lives can complicate this goal. There are different situations that influence our own IRAs. Depending upon how much money we invest or how the stock market does will add or subtract from their final total. Such is the same plan of action that merits us eternal life with God in heaven. How do I respond to the negatives from others in my present life situations? What actions or words does God wish me to do or say that will keep me “profitable” in His eyes. Negative responses are like “bad investments.” They either reduce or wipe out our plans to continue walking in the footsteps of Jesus, our Teacher. This being a “healing weekend,” we pray for physical, emotional, and/or spiritual healing. Let us ask God to “be healed” from all that is “negative” in our own personal lives. Speak to God this weekend as if you are talking to your “primary care doctor” or your “financial retirement coordinator.” Ask for help in your areas of weakness. Ask God to help you pray for those who persecute or influence your life in a negative way. Healing is change. Ask God to give you the grace to not be afraid to “change.”
