This weekend we are celebrating the National Weekend of Prayer for Faith, Hope and Life. This is a weekend to be “inspired” - to be inspired to change our way of approaching life’s situations by asking for help. Prayer is the greatest DAILY gift that God gives to us. Our readings remind us that we cannot be successful in life without another’s help. Success is defined as: a favorable outcome to our plans and goals. Our daily prayer is to ask God to inspire us each day to seek His will in all that we do. The Book of Wisdom reminds us that God had and has no teacher. God is the ultimate Teacher, Counselor, Spouse, Superior, and Friend. When we plan with God, we ask for His help. We ask to be inspired to change our way of thinking regarding what we can accomplish today and how we can inspire others to seek God first in their plans and goals each day. We only need, as St. Paul reminds us, to accept Onesimus, his disciple, in place of Paul because of Paul’s imprisonment. Historically, Onesimus is believed to be an escaped slave who sought refuge with St. Paul and the early Christian community. Onesimus was inspired by them to be baptized and then he preached in public what he had been taught. He was inspired to seek the reason for his life of faith, hope and life by teaching what had inspired him to change through the words and works of others and ultimately God’s inspiration and influence. 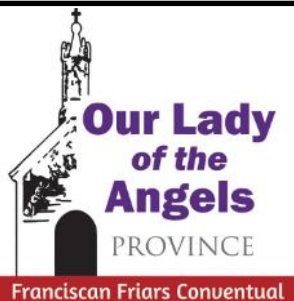
